Learn And Grow: Seed Collecting & Saving For Flowers And Vegetables

Heide Aufdermaur a retired teacher and a 2019 graduate of the Stanislaus Master Gardening Program, will join us for the October Learn and Grow. She has been a member of the Riverbank Heirloom Garden Club since 2010.

Heide began growing Heirloom vegetables in 2010 in her neighbor’s empty lot behind his house. She is still learning how to grow these vegetables and save the seeds for the coming year. Currently she has eight raised beds in her back yard, 4 x 8 where she grows most of her vegetables.

Heide says, “I enjoy growing my own vegetables, knowing they are not sprayed with pesticides.”

During her talk you will learn about the two major types of seed Classification; how to save seeds using the Fermentation Method; saving seeds from plants with pods; and planting guides.

Heide will answer questions you may have, as time permits. Come join us.
