Did You Know? ~ by Jean Davis

Did you know the Modesto Garden Club supports local charity Stanislaus Wildlife Care Center in Hughson, California? For the past 40 years they have taken injured and orphaned native wild animals and care for them so

they can be released back into their natural environment. They are a Non-Profit, all volunteer program with 32 volunteers (some part-time) taking care of approximately 2,300 wild animals and birds a year! Here is



some advice for dealing with wildlife you may find injured or orphaned. INJURED: Put the animal in a cardboard box just large enough for it to stand. Keep it warm and quiet. Bring the animal in as soon as possible. The longer it goes without medical attention, the less likely it is to survive. ORPHANED BABIES: DO NOT feed the animal. The wrong diet or feeding method is fatal. Keep the animal warm and bring in as soon as possible.

Stanislaus Wildlife (SWCCenter@stanislauswildlife.org) is currently dealing with shore birds and other birds who have been infected with Avian botulism. The Tulare Lake has been dry until this year after rain. The water warms up and bacteria spreads, causing paralysis in birds. Exposure causes the birds to become paralyzed. Their best chance at survival is at the Stanislaus Wildlife Care Center. Thanks to our members we collected almost \$300 at our meeting in September. Thank you all for your compassionate hearts!

The committee is using multiple resources to develop lessons

sources such as The Edible Schoolyard, Slow Food, Math in the Garden and more. As soon as this small but powerful committee finalizes plans there will be additional photos to post. Enslen Elementary's School Principal, Brandon Fromm, has graciously provided the following information about their school garden:



The Enslen school garden primarily serves 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students as well as the Enslen Boys and Girls Club members. Part of the funding for the school garden comes from Expanded Learning and some is provided by the Modesto Garden Club. The Enslen Garden Club advisors include Madeleine Lehikainen and Cydney Casteel. The school gardens revitalization was on behalf of Pennie Kreifels, a beloved Enslen school employee. Only one year old, the renewed garden supports crops of pretty cut flowers, pumpkins, sunflowers, lettuce, peppers and tomatoes!

Modesto Garden Club continues to provide financial support for gardening tools, seeds and plants, while the Stanislaus County Master Gardeners will provide lessons to enrich the Enslen School academic program.
