

October Speaker - Lee Miller

Lee Miller is a man in action for the outdoors. As

with many of us, our roots start to create our future passions. As a young boy, Lee grew up on a family farm in New Jersey and he learned gardening from his mother and farming from his father. Lee attended Elizabethtown College, graduating with a BS in biology in 1960 and in 1963 he received an MS in biological sciences from the University of Delaware.

Moving to the sunshine state, he worked for California Fish and Wildlife for 37 years as a fisheries biologist. In San Joaquin County, Lee farmed, gardened, and produced wine on 10 acres for 41 years.

Lee recently downsized his property to just two-thirds of an acre and living in a smaller home in Morada, near Stockton. His gardening interests have included composting, plant propagation, grapes, fruit trees, heirloom tomatoes, gladioli, daylilies, dahlias, and roses, among others.

He was in the first class of San Joaquin County UCCE Master Gardeners in 2007 and was an accredited National Garden Club flower show judge before retiring from that in 2020. He received the Golden Trowel award from the Master Garden Program and the Green Thumb award from the Linden Garden Club, of which he became the first male member in 2001.

Lee will be speaking on Dahlias and Composting at our October meeting.


